Henry Livesey bowled with pace, and all three spinners (Jack Taylor, Oliver Fidler and Tom Newman) showed good control with a slippery ball. It was left to Harvey Johnston to bowl an excellent maiden in the final over to leave Giggleswick on 65-3.
