

UK BORDER REQUIREMENTS FOR SEPTEMBER 2020

PUBLIC HEALTH PASSENGER LOCATOR FORM

It is compulsory for all arrivals to the UK to complete this form.

There are changes at the UK border to protect the health of travellers. These changes can be read about on the Government website: <https://www.gov.uk/uk-border-control>

In the 48 hours before you travel to the UK, you are required to provide contact, journey and onward travel & accommodation information (via the Government website) so you can be contacted if you, or someone you may have been in contact with, develop Covid-19.

The **Public Health Passenger Locator Form** and instructions on completing it are on the Government website: <https://www.gov.uk/provide-journey-contact-details-before-travel-uk>. To complete the Form you will need: your passport information; your travel details including times and dates; and the address where you will stay in the UK. You should print out the Form once completed or download it so you can show it on a mobile phone on arrival.

AIRPORT COLLECTION AND SCHOOL CONTACT DETAILS

This should be used in addition to the compulsory Public Health Passenger Locator Form.
